

SAN BENITO HISTORIC VILLAGE

Come with us on a local adventure! Meet us at San Benito Historic Village on SATURDAY, APRIL 21st at HIGH NOON. Bring your own lunch........... we'll have a picnic there, followed by a wonderful tour of the village, led by Don Pidd of the San Benito Historical Society.

The Village is located just off Hwy 25, one mile south of Tres Pinos. Watch for the sign on the west side of the road. If you'd like to car pool, some of us will leave from the Gilroy Museum at 11:15 AM.

"The Village" at the San Benito County Historical Park has many buildings of historical significance moved to the Park from various parts of San Benito County including the Sullivan House (one of the first homes in Hollister), the Tres Pinos Jail, the Willow Creek School (relocated from near the Pinnacles), and one of the three original Firehouses from Hollister. Other structures, antique farm equipment, a nature trail, gardens, a children's play area, and several large picnic areas make a visit to the Park enjoyable for all.

GOALS FOR OUR ENDOWMENT FUND WITH THE GILROY FOUNDATION

We are making excellent progress on our Museum Endowment Fund, thanks to our most generous donors. The purpose of the fund is "to benefit the Gilroy Museum", with our primary goal to eventually be able to hire a Museum Director, at least half time. We are doing well for now at the museum with a wonderful cadre of 30 volunteers. We believe that in the long run we will benefit from having a professional director to continue the work of being a significant local history museum and research center.

Now, for the realities of our efforts and our goal. In order to hire a museum director half time, 20 hours per week @ \$20/hour x50 weeks/year we would need income of \$20,000/year. You can see that for our endowment fund to produce this kind of income we will need a very sizeable amount. We are doing very well so far, with a current balance in the Foundation of \$79,710.42. In the future we will also want to coordinate with Warren Lindeleaf about the use of the Lindeleaf Fund, whose purpose is to keep the museum open for visitation. The City of Gilroy is doing its part too, by maintaining our wonderful Carnegie library building. The Gilroy Museum will always want and need volunteers, but a professional director will ensure the integrity of the collection for posterity.

MUSEUM NEWS

Very exciting news is that we hope to begin filming a video of the main floor of the museum this spring. The main purpose of the video CD is to provide an alternative form of handicapped access for people who are unable to climb the thirteen steps into the museum. We discovered that the Historic Building Code allows alternative methods of providing access if traditional methods prove infeasible. The wonderful thing is that the CD can be taken to schools, club meetings and shown on TV, plus we can use still photos on our website. A big THANK YOU goes to the Gilroy Rotary Club for awarding us a matching grant of \$1000. We've applied to the Gilroy Foundation for the match and should find out the results soon. [Update: Yes! Volunteers have been working on a major project of identifying and indexing all of the photos. Next will come the laborious task of entering them into our Past Perfect software. GIVE US YOUR NOMINATIONS FOR OUR 2012 ARCHITECTURAL AWARDS

Have you noticed a historic building that is "looking good" this year? Submit your nominations for the Society's 2012 Architectural Awards. by e-mail to the Gilroy Museum at Gilroy.Museum@ci.gilroy.ca.us or by regular mail to the Museum at 195 Fifth St. by April 30th

The categories are:

- 1) Historic Design Award for a new building in the downtown Historic District that enhances historic downtown and complements the original historic buildings.
- 2) Historic Commercial Building Award for a building at least 50 years old in the downtown Historic District that restores, retains or preserves the building's historical, cultural or architectural values.
- 3) Historic House Award for a home that is at least 50 years old that is an outstanding example of restoration and renovation, exterior only.
- 4) Certificate of Commendation for residential or commercial. This can be for new construction, restoration, renovation, additions, landscaping, painting or significant improvement.
