THE HISTORIC 1890 CHESBRO HOUSE IS ON THE MARKET

After 123 years, the Eastlake style Victorian Chesbro House at 7541 Church Street is slated to leave the family for the first time. The Gilroy Advocate dubbed the home "the chief ornament of the block" when it was completed in July 1890. Descendants of its original owner, Gilroy pioneer physician and mayor, Heverland R. Chesbro, MD, have always occupied the home. The house passed first to his third son Don Chesbro, in 1928 when Dr. Chesbro and his wife Lily moved to a new home they built next door at 7531 Church Street. In 1995 the home was purchased from Don's daughter Mary Lou Chase by the current owners, Dr. Chesbro's great-granddaughter **Elizabeth Barratt** and her husband Dick. The Barratts have lovingly cared for the historic home over the past 18 years but are now planning to retire to Carmel Valley. They say they will miss Gilroy and the Chesbro House and hope the next occupants will have a family to fill the home's many spacious rooms. **Katherine McBride** of Windemere Real Estate is handling the sale.
